Principal's Report - Lesley McCarthy

I thank all the parents who nominated for their willingness to contribute their time and efforts to our students and school. Thanks also to Adrienne McIntosh, Sandra McOrist, Gabrielle Nilsson who assisted with the election process and Marc Sinatra who acted as a scrutineer.

This week we have welcomed another group of **Student Teachers** into our school. The role of the FPS staff in introducing new members to our profession and assisting them to develop the necessary skills for life as a Primary teacher are invaluable. These partnerships also bring new ideas, strategies and enthusiasm into classes and provide for an improved learning environment for our students. Thanks to Leonie Isaacs who coordinates the placements.

Congratulations to Ryan Dunn, Grade ¾ Coordinator, who has been successful in his application for entry into the **Leaders In The Making Program** through the Western Metropolitan Region and the Australian Government Quality Teacher Program. The leadership program will assist Ryan in the development and refinement of his leadership and management abilities. The course will commence in Term 2.

The 2007 Year 6 students returned to FPS on Tuesday afternoon for the traditional **Back to School Transition** session. This invaluable opportunity allows the Year 7s and the Grade 6s to discuss the transition to secondary school, the positives and challenges, the myths and the facts. All students have the opportunity to hear about the programs at different schools and catch up with friends again. Students also contributed some excellent suggestions which will be implemented into the revised Transition Program. Thanks to Bruce Ziebell and Grace Nunez for their organization.

Over recent weeks, Sandra McOrist, Bruce Ziebell, Grade 5/6 teachers and I have dealt with several incidents of bullying. This has involved many children in Grades 4-6 and has included teasing, gossip, spreading rumours, name calling, physical violence and the use of MSN and chat programs. While each case is treated individually, there have been sufficient similarities, that despite several conversations with students, we believe it is vital for parents to be aware and discuss this with their children.

Parents are asked to discuss this issue with their children; to focus on Resilience, Getting Along With Others and the Catastrophe Scale. A closer monitoring of MSN Messenger etc may also assist in reducing the online issues.

Congratulations to James Boyce, one of our School Leaders, who has nominated to have his head shaved to raise funds for **"Shave for a Cure"** next Friday. James joins Jacob Mason & Ryan Dunn who made this commitment last year as ambassadors for our school. The Shave will take place at lunchtime in the Multi Purpose room. A gold coin donation to the Leukemia Foundation through James will gain entry to view the shave.

FROM THE SUGGESTION BOX

At 9.20am on Monday an incident occurred when a parent was preparing to cross Mt Alexander Rd (no crossing supervisor on at the time). The lights were red for traffic and green for pedestrians. Feeling safe to cross this parent stepped out onto the road and was hit by a cyclist running a red light.

The cyclist swerved and as he did not fall he continued riding and yelling "Sorry" as he sped away. This parent was left dazed but fortunately not hurt.

All of us at Flemington Primary School community need to take extra care at this dangerous intersection. It is not only the cars we need to be aware of, but bicycles as well. If the rider had hit a young child - one of our students or a child from the childcare centre - this could have been a very serious incident. One fatality has already occurred when a pedestrian was hit by a speeding cyclist on Beach Road not so long ago.



A reminder to all parents, if dropping off or picking up children, the driveway entrance at Flemington Street is dangerous and not an acceptable place to do so. Parents are not permitted to wait or park in the driveway at any time but particularly not in the before and after school rush periods.

The driveway is used by through traffic to the school and by pedestrians leaving the school. A teacher is on duty in this area from 3:30 -3:45 and will record the registration numbers of persons who do not obey the rules. The Traffic section of MVCC have been asked to patrol this area.

HOMWORK HABITS

Homework helps students by complementing and reinforcing classroom learning, fostering good lifelong learning and study habits, and providing an opportunity for students to be responsible for their own learning.

Parents and caregivers can help their children by:

- encouraging them to take increasing responsibility for their learning and organisation;
- observing and acknowledging their success and asking how their home and class work is progressing;
- attending school events, displays or productions in which their children are involved;
- encouraging them to set aside a regular daily session to read and complete homework;
- setting an example by reading themselves;
- contacting the relevant teacher to discuss any problems their children are having with homework;
- helping them to complete homework by discussing key questions or directing them to resources. Usually it is better to encourage children to complete homework themselves;
- helping them to balance the amount of time spent completing homework, watching television, playing computer games and engaging in other leisure or recreational activities;
- checking whether homework for upper primary and secondary students has been set and ensuring they keep a homework diary;
- reading texts set by teachers. Discussing their child's response to the texts and asking to see work they complete in relation to these texts, and
- discussing homework in their first language, where English is not the main language spoken at home, and linking it to their previous experiences.
