✓	Problem Behaviour	Definition
	Anti Social behaviour	Making nasty, catty or insulting comments to or about a person. Excluding and isolating others from groups and activities.
	Disruption	Sustained disruptive behaviour that prevents teaching and learning from continuing. Only issue after reasonable attempts to correct behaviour have failed.
	Fighting/assault	Fighting involves the exchange of mutual physical contact, such as pushing, shoving, hitting with or without injury. Assault refers to behaviour in which one student or a group of students inflicted bodily harm to another student or staff member.
	Leaving the classroom or school grounds without permission.	Leaving the classroom without permission from the class or specialist teacher. Leaving the school grounds at any time between 8.45am – 3.30pm.
	Lying	Refusing to tell the truth or lying about their own actions or the actions of another when asked.
	Non Compliance	Refusal to follow instructions or directions when reasonable efforts have been made to enable a student to cooperate.
	Other crisis behaviour	Having serious low incident behaviour that affects safety or is regarded as a crisis or emergency behaviour.
	Theft	Taking property belonging to the school, an individual or group of students or a staff member without permission.
	Vandalism / graffiti	Intentionally causing damage to or defacing school property or the property of other students.
	Weapons	Being in possession of any weapon including simulated weapons. Weapons are defined as but not limited to spray cans containing noxious gases including mace and pepper spray, knives or any sort, sharp implements, brass knuckles etc.
