Flemington Primary School will be using an **online only** ordering system for Book Packs for 2024 with our stationery supplier, Paperchase Office National. There will be **NO** collection day at the school.

- Foundation, Yr. 1, and Yr. 2 orders will be delivered to the school for distribution to the students at start of Term.
- Yr. 3 Yr. 6 orders will be delivered to your nominated home address. PO boxes not allowed.

Foundation to Year 6

2024 BOOKPACKS ARE TO BE ORDERED ONLINE WITH PAPERCHASE AND BOOKPACKS WILL BE DELIVERED TO HOME ADDRESSES FOR YR. 3 TO YR. 6, AND TO THE SCHOOL FOR FOUNDATON TO YR. 2 FREE DELIVERY IF ORDERED BEFORE DECEMBER 10TH OR \$10 DELIVERY FEE IF ORDERED AFTER THIS DATE.

BOOK PACKS AT HOME SHOULD BE BROUGHT TO SCHOOL ON THE FIRST DAY.

ONLINE ORDERING INSTRUCTIONS

<u>PLEASE READ CAREFULLY</u> as the process may have changed from previous years

DUE DATE: 10 DECEMBER 2023

We will again be using an **online only** ordering system for Book Packs for 2024 with our stationery supplier Paperchase Office National.

- Orders <u>must be placed by the due date</u> in order for your child to receive their pack for the first day of Term 1.
- Orders place after the due date <u>may NOT be processed until early February</u> due to our extremely busy schedule in January.
 - Paperchase will do their best to ensure timely delivery, are not guaranteed to be delivered before school starts. We apologise if you are a new enrolment or missed the due date due to unavoidable circumstances, but the school is aware your pack may not be ready on the first day of school, so your child will not be disadvantaged.
- There will be NO collection day at the school.
- <u>Prep, Year 1 and Year 2 packs</u> will be <u>delivered to the school*</u> for distribution to the students at start of Term 1.
- Year 3 Year 6 orders will be <u>delivered free of charge</u>* to your <u>nominated delivery address</u> before the <u>start of Term 1</u> <u>2024</u> if <u>placed by the due date</u>
- Do not put the school address as your nominated address. If you do, it will be returned to Paperchase. PO boxes also not allowed.
- All packs will be delivered to the school or home and cannot be collected from Paperchase.
- Complete packs only can be ordered through Paperchase. We do not have a walk-in shop and individual items cannot be purchased. All orders must be placed online.

*Free delivery offer ends 10th December 2023. Orders placed after this date will be charged a standard \$10 delivery fee. (Orders placed in one transaction for multiple children at the same time will only attract one \$10 fee) All orders will be delivered to home address for all year levels (school delivery for Foundation to Year 2 must be made by 10/12/23).

Please note packing and dispatching of orders are often done by year level and orders for multiple children <u>may</u> not be delivered together.

Online Ordering Procedure

- 1. Go to http://booklist.paperchase.com.au
- 2. Enter the correct school access code depending on year level for 2024:
 - Foundation, Year 1, Year 2 (delivered to school): FPSF2
 - Years 3 6 (home delivered): FPS36
- 3. Click 'Create Order',
- 4. Enter students first and last name, choose year level for 2024 from the drop-down list and follow the prompts to place your order.

Please check your E-mail for order receipt. If you do not receive email confirmation, please contact Paperchase directly to confirm your order was placed correctly. Please do not put the school email address down as your contact.

PLEASE NOTE: All packs will be delivered to your nominated delivery address and therefore must be pre-paid. Payment must be made during the online ordering process, by Visa or Mastercard (credit card or debit card accepted). ZIP Pay also available*

If you elect not to purchase the book pack through Paperchase <u>please ensure children come to school on the first day</u> with the required <u>materials</u> as <u>detailed on the Student Book Pack List</u>.

FREE INSTRUCTION

- Schools provide students with free instruction and ensure students have free access to all items, activities and services that are used by the school to fulfil the standard curriculum requirements in Victorian Curriculum F-10, VCE and VCAL.
- Schools may invite parents to make a financial contribution to support the school.

PARENT PAYMENT REQUESTS

Schools can request contributions from parents under three categories:



Curriculum Contributions

Voluntary financial contributions for curriculum items and activities which the school deems necessary for students to learn the Curriculum.

Other Contributions

Voluntary financial contributions for non-curriculum items and activities that relate to the school's functions and objectives.

Extra-Curricular Items and Activities

Items and activities that enhance or broaden the schooling experience of students and are above and beyond what the school provides for free to deliver the Curriculum. These are provided on a user-pays basis.

• Schools may also invite parents to supply or purchase educational items to use and own (e.g. textbooks, stationery, digital devices).



FINANCIAL HELP FOR FAMILIES

- Schools put in place financial hardship arrangements to support families who cannot pay for items or activities so that their child doesn't miss out.
- Schools have a nominated parent payment contact person(s) that parents can have a confidential discussion with regarding financial hardship arrangements.



SCHOOL PROCESSES
