

At School Supports

At Flemington PS, we have the following supports in place for our Foundation students when they begin school:

- Designated play spaces for just our Foundation to Year 2 students
- Allowance of additional time for eating
- Explicit teaching of school routines and expectations
- Social Emotional Learning (SEL) that teaches turn taking, co-operation and self-regulation
- Pre - Foundation assessments to identify individuals' needs (Literacy & Numeracy)

Arrival & Pick UP

In the morning - Kiss and Drop at 8.55am

- Students will line up outside when the music starts. Teachers will walk their students into the classroom. Parents and carers stay outside the Foundation rooms.

In the afternoon - Collect at pick up at 3:30pm

- Students will walk out to their line up area , once they see their adult they will let their teacher know. Their teacher will then dismiss them.

Ways to get to school

- Ride/scooter
- Walk
- Padman Lane has designated drop off zones-kiss & drop
- Disabled car parks in Padman Lane are for authorised cars only

FPS School Uniform

- The official school uniform is compulsory
- Our uniform enhances a positive image, sense of belonging & connectedness
- Please label your child's clothing with their full name. **Especially their hat and jumper!**
- Pack a change of clothes especially underwear and socks
- Purchase uniform from *DCS Uniforms*. Second hand uniforms can be purchased from office for a gold coin donation



What will your child bring home

Your child's satchel will include:

- Five home reading books - Changed once a week
- Notes and communication about learning
- Please ensure that you check your child's satchel daily



Packing a Healthy Lunchbox

- Include healthy food that you eat at home and that your child is familiar with
- We have two eating breaks – Snack break and Lunch break
- Classes also have a 'Fruit/Vegetable' break
- Bring a drink bottle with water.
- Inclusive food allergies practises



Foundation Classes

- Students are placed in class groups to best support learning
- As we have a flexible learning space, the Foundation Team complete many lessons and activities together
- Classes are organised considering:
 - Kinder groups
 - Recommendations of kinder teachers
 - Balance of genders and possible additional needs



Wellbeing at Flemington PS

FPS Wellbeing Team & supports:

- Wellbeing Assistant Principal
- Mental Health and Wellbeing Leader
- During different times of the year, we can offer:
 - Art Therapy
 - Targeted Social Skill groups

Our whole-school wellbeing approaches include:

- School Wide Positive Behaviour Support -SWPBS
- Respectful Relationships
- Zones of Regulation
- Restorative Conversations
- Mind & Body Club two days a week

School Attendance

EVERY DAY COUNTS



- Attendance at school is required every day!
- Missing one day a fortnight is the same as missing FOUR whole weeks
- From Foundation to Year 12, that adds up to 1.5 years of school!
- Are there any good reasons to be away from school?
 - If they are sick
 - A significant event they need to attend
 - Notify the school via Compass or phone call
- If your child is having problems getting to school, please reach out to their teacher and the Wellbeing Assistant Principal

- Attend whole school assemblies and then visit our canteen - Friday pm
- Attend our community events

Preparing for School

These are some things that you can practice at home:

- Get them to pack and carry their own school/kinder bag
- Walk independently
- Open and close their own lunch box
- Eat independently
- Practise personal hygiene: using the toilet, washing hands
- Get dressed - putting on and removing jumpers, wearing the school uniform
- Learn to recognise their name and practise writing it
- Arrange to meet friends outside of school hours (play at school after school hours)



Preparing for the First Day

- Discuss what drop-off will look like
 - Hug and say goodbye
- Acknowledge and discuss any questions or concerns they may have
- Use positive statements/talk when discussing school
- Practice your route to school
 - Walking/riding/scooting/driving
- Read the Social Story that your child will get at today's transition session
