Platforms to support FPS Remote Learning

ClassDojo

FPS will be using ClassDojo which most of our FPS families are already familiar with. For those that are new to ClassDojo, welcome to this new technology! Lessons will be uploaded to Class Dojo daily. Parents and carers can communicate with their child's teacher and our Specialist teachers via ClassDojo. Portfolios, contained in ClassDojo can also be used to upload your child's work, photos and video messages to teachers.

Webex-video conferencing tool. Webex is a DET backed platform and has passed all DET security requirements. There is a Webex for families fact sheet that includes information about Webex and how to access 'learning from home'.

Expectations of students, parents and teachers with Remote Learning

Like we do in the classroom, we set expectations with students about how everyone is expected to behave to ensure it is an enjoyable and safe environment for all. Please see below expectations for students, teachers and parents for our lessons. This will help ensure everyone has an understanding of how FPS Remote Learning will take place. 1.Student expectations

- Students will access the learning material and complete tasks when they can
- Students will listen to/read the teacher's instructions
- Students will share their learning with their teacher via ClassDojo when/if they can
- Students will complete work tasks in the home learning book

2.Parent expectations

- Parents will access ClassDojo for the weekly overview and daily breakdown of lessons and share material with their child
- Parents are encouraged to allow their child/children time to work independently

- Parents will communicate with the classroom teacher any questions via ClassDojo
 - Parents are expected to read Compass updates for all information regarding Flemington Primary School and understand that Compass is the official channel for all official school communications.
 - Parents will monitor student's online communications

We know that not all students will be able to communicate and share via ClassDojo. All students will be required to return their 'home learning' book when they return to school for assessment and feedback purposes.

3. Teacher expectations

- Teachers will offer learning experiences, materials and support aligned with our essential learnings
- Teachers will provide daily lessons and feedback on student learning where applicable
 - Teachers and ES staff will collaborate to assist students at their point of need

Helpful tips to prepare your child for FPS Remote Learning

- Create a quiet learning space for your child that is free from distractions with resources ready to go
- Ensure your child records their daily learning tasks in their home learning book
- Find a stable (i.e. desk/table and chair) position for your child to work on - moving screens are a distraction for all learners
- Standing over your child's shoulder can be distracting- try to give them the space to engage with their learning and provide support when needed
